

OTOLARYNGOLOGY-HEAD & NECK SURGERY Time allocation to study for the Royal College Examination

Fifth-year residents can take up to six (6) weeks off before the Royal College examination

The six (6) weeks of studying are divided as follow:

- Residents can use up to three (3) weeks of vacation consecutively (must enter a vacation request)
- The program allocates three (3) weeks of study time
- The six (6) weeks allowed for studying do not include the days of the exams

Attendance to the program's educational activities is mandatory during the three (3) weeks of study time (Grand rounds, COCLIA, Teaching, and Journal Club)

Residents must take one week of vacation before the end of January

Also, residents attend the Halifax review course (duration one week)

During the radiology/pathology rotation and their six (6) weeks of study time, fifth-year residents are exempt from doing calls

After finishing their Royal College exams, fifth-year residents must:

- Return on rotation to complete their training and list of EPAs
- Fulfill the program's requirements to graduate
- Resume taking call
